

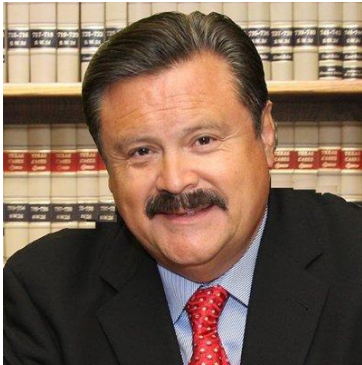

DOMINGO GARCIA, NEWLY ELECTED LULAC NATIONAL PRESIDENT



On July 21, 2018, Dallas attorney Domingo Garcia was elected president of the League of United Latin American Citizens ("LULAC") nation's oldest Latino civil rights organization. Garcia's victory took place at LULAC's 89th National Convention held in Phoenix Arizona. President Garcia will now serve as the national leader and beacon for all members of LULAC.

A large majority of LULAC members encouraged Garcia to run for LULAC's highest post because of his long history of work and experience on civil rights and immigration reform. He said he hopes his commitment to pro-immigrant policies will restore public confidence in LULAC. "We're at a crucial point in history when Latinos are under attack," Garcia stated. "People wanted a national voice that would speak for them in a strong and uniting manner." Garcia served as a Dallas City Council member from 1991-1995 and was the first Latino elected Mayor Pro Tem in Dallas, TX. Garcia also served as a member of the Texas House of Representatives, where he co-authored a 2001 measure signed into law by then-Gov. Rick Perry that granted undocumented immigrants in Texas the right to pay in-state tuition at public state universities if they graduated from a Texas high school.
