Professor Bianco is the recipient of multiple awards including the Outstanding Researcher Award from the Council for Learning Disabilities, University of Colorado Denver's Rosa Parks Diversity Award, University of Colorado President's Diversity Award, University of Colorado's Teaching Excellence Award, in 2017 Dr. Bianco was named the University of Colorado Timmerhaus Teaching Ambassador (2017-2019). In March 2019, Dr. Bianco was recognized by Diverse: Issues in Higher Education as one of the nation's top 35 women in higher education.
