Resolution to Allow Veteran's Admission to Armed Forces Events

WHEREAS, 84 years ago, the founders of the League of United Latin American citizens (LULAC) joined together to establish an organization that would become the largest, oldest, and most successful civil rights and service organization in the United States, and

WHEREAS, Latinos have served in every war the United States has been engaged in since the War for Independence against British Rule and elsewhere, and

WHEREAS, Latinos and LULAC members have served in the Armed Forces that keep the U.S. and its Allies safe and secure and protects our guaranteed rights and liberties, and

WHEREAS, Latinos and LULAC Members have shed their blood in many battlefields around the globe in defense of our the USA, our beloved country of the Brave and Free, and

WHEREAS, The USA is Free because of the Brave who have jeopardized their own lives and families to secure our country and its allies, and

WHEREAS, All Veterans of the Armed Forces should be permitted to attend all Military-related Banquets, Defenders of Freedom Breakfasts or receptions where we recognize their duty to our country.

THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED THAT, The National LULAC Assembly meeting in its Annual Session in Salt Lake City, Utah voted in favor of allowing Veterans to attend Military-related events free of charge as recognition of the valuable service they have provide to secure and sustain our Democracy, American Way of Life.
