RESOLUTION TO SUPPORT STEM EDUCATION AND CAREERS IN AMERICA'S ENERGY FUTURE

WHEREAS, LULAC advances the economic condition and educational condition and educational attainment of Hispanic in the United States; and,

WHEREAS, LULAC supports public school and community programs that help place Hispanic youth into Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) career paths; and,

WHEREAS, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics projects STEM occupations to grow at a faster rate compared with all other occupations; and,

WHEREAS, Hispanic males represent only 5.3% and Hispanic Women 1.7% of all workers in STEM careers; and,

WHEREAS, the highest-paying STEM careers are in the field of energy from Texas to California, 123,000/year, nearly double the private sector average; and,

WHEREAS, a single wage earner in the oil and gas energy industry is able to afford buying his family a home and provide for his children's education; and,

WHEREAS, the oil and gas energy industry has full-time Hispanic workers from those with a GEDs, a PhD, with benefits and opportunities to be promoted; and,

WHEREAS, these Hispanics in oil and gas energy include single parents, veterans, second chance workers, first generation bilingual citizens, grandparents, union members and,

WHEREAS, oil and gas producers, for example in California, are committed environmental stewards of our precious ecosystems, and operate under the most stringent regulations in the world, and,

WHEREAS, oil and gas producers are evolving their technologies to incorporate all forms of energy including I, natural gas and renewable such as wind, solar, and hydroelectric power; and,

WHEREAS, in local oil and natural gas producers from the Texas Gulf Coast to California's Pacific Coast are leading the way to a new energy future for all by investing in cutting edge technologies; and,

WHEREAS, oil and gas producers are collaborating with developers to develop new breakthrough technologies that transition and further diversity America's local energy resources.

THEREORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that LULAC supports STEM Jobs in the constantly evolving energy industry as it advances into America's energy future and Hispanics who already benefit from a career; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOVLED that LULAC supports STEM Careers in Energy Programs for Hispanic Youth partnering with educational institutions, professional organizations and local oil and gas employees.
